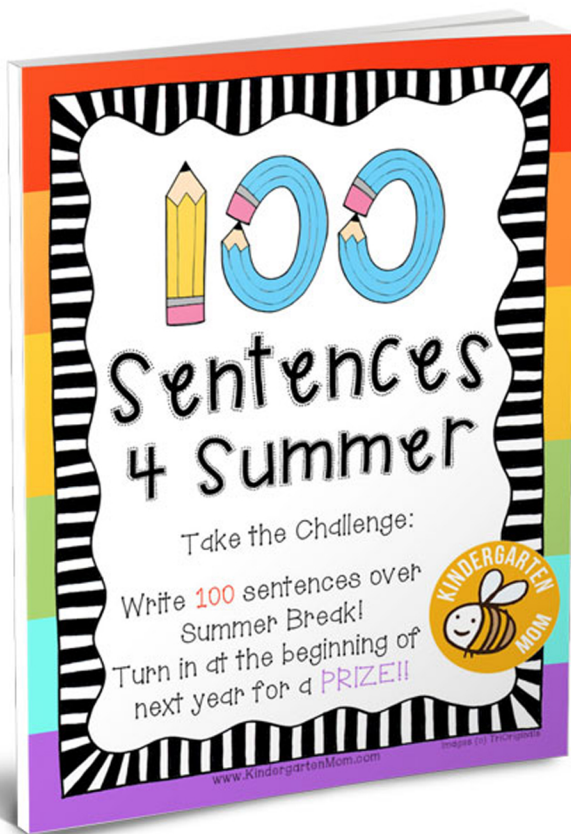

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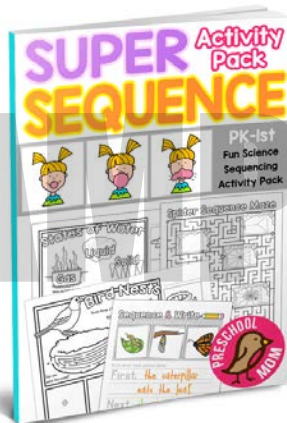
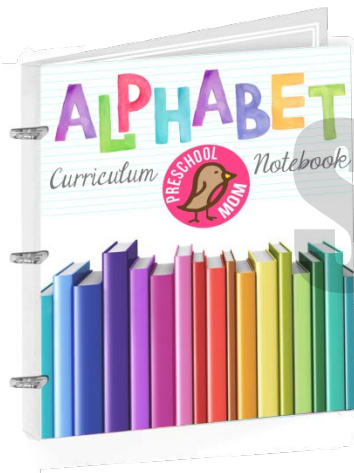
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How to Write a Sentence:

5. Add a noun if needed:

The boy ate stinky radishes

6. End your sentence with an end mark:

The boy ate stinky radishes.
