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







## Fine Motor Skills Bundle: Holidays & Seasons

This bundle pack includes 10 months (40-weeks) of thematic hands-on activities organized into monthly packs. Each monthly pack includes 60 pages of varied resources, organized weekly themes based on seasons and holidays. Each sheet is designed to build key fine motor skills or to strengthen small motor muscles. The majority of the activities are considered non-consumable, meaning they can be reused by placing them inside page protectors. The remaining pages of each week are considered consumable as they require cutting, gluing, dabbing and poking. Many pages are adaptable if you do not have the required manipulatives. For example, you can have students color with crayons instead of dabbing or building. A full list of suggested materials is found below, as well as a weekly overview of the included activities.


## WEEKLY ACTIVITIES

<p><b>GEOBOARD</b></p> <p>Students use rubber bands to create the pictures on a geoboard. Each sheet features a letter of the alphabet alongside a thematic picture.</p> <p>Materials: 5x5 Geoboard, Rubberbands</p>		<p><b>PUZZLE PICTURES</b></p> <p>Students use puzzle blocks to create thematic pictures. Student count up the amount of blocks they used for each shape, and report the totals below.</p> <p>Materials: Pattern Blocks</p>	
<p><b>MAZES</b></p> <p>Students solve the mazes and follow the prompts. Each page features thematic mazes alongside a tracing activity or prompt.</p>		<p><b>CUISENAIRE™ ROD PICTURES</b></p> <p>Students use colorful centimeter rods to build thematic pictures. Students are asked to color the rod key to show how many rods they used of each color.</p> <p>Materials: Cuisenaire™ Rods</p>	
<p><b>PLAY DOUGH</b></p> <p>Students use play dough to complete the prompts. Prompts require students to form and shape the dough to make pictures, solve problems, or complete the scene.</p> <p>Materials: Play dough</p>		<p><b>BRICK BUILDERS</b></p> <p>Students use LEGO™ or other classic building bricks to recreate these thematic pictures. Students work on reading, writing, planning, addition, subtraction, sorting &amp; stacking while completing the final picture.</p> <p>Materials: LEGO™ or other classic brick</p>	

## WEEKLY ACTIVITIES (cont...)

### TRACING


Students trace the pictures with colored pencils or fine tip markers. Each page features thematic content and prompts students to complete the pictures.



### POM PICTURE 1

Students use pom-poms to recreate the picture. For added difficulty have students use plastic tweezers to pick up the poms.



### CUBE CREATIONS

Students use counting cubes to make thematic pictures. These cubes can be snapped together. If you do not have cubes, students can color the squares in the grid to match the picture.

Materials: Snap Cubes




### LISTENING SKILL SHEETS

Teachers read the directions aloud as the student listens carefully to finish each task. Tasks involve fine motor skills such as tracing, drawing, coloring, and more to decipher prepositional clues.



### CUT & SORT CROWNS


Each crown features a theme alongside a 4-step sequencing pattern. Students cut out the pictures and glue them in the correct order. Students write their name, color the pictures, then staple the sides to make a crown.



### SPECIAL SKILLS SHEETS

Students work on a variety of different skills including dot-2-dots, pin & poke, q-tip painting, and scissor skills. Students follow the instructions to build key fine motor skills.


Materials: Pin Dowel, Q-tips, Paint



### DAB & DOT\*\*

Students use daubers to dab by number in order to reveal the mystery picture. (Hold at a distance to help students see the pictures)


Materials: Dab & Dot Markers



### POPSICLE STICK CRAFTIVITY

These crafty projects are perfect for little hands. Students color, glue, and cut to make fun, thematic pictures. Have glue, glitter, wiggle eyes and pipe cleaners on hand.


Materials: Popsicle Sticks, Markers



### POM PICTURE 2\*\*

Students use pom-poms to complete the picture. For added difficulty have students use plastic tweezers to pick up the poms. Alternatively students can glue poms to make these sheets into a simple craft project.

Materials: Pom-Poms or Mini-Poms



\*Layer the picture, construction paper, cardboard and then tape the edges. Students use a pushpin to poke through the layers. When finished, separate the layers to reveal the dotted picture on the construction paper. Hang up in a window to see the light shine through!


\*\* These work well with circle stickers too. To make this non-consumable, use bingo counters, or glue pom-poms to circle magnets. Then, have students use the sheet on a magnetic cookie sheet.




